Sir Mark Moody-Stuart, KCMG

Sir Mark Moody-Stuart was chairman of Anglo American plc from 2002-2009. From 1998-2001 he was chairman of the Royal Dutch/Shell Group of companies. He was co-Chair of the G8 Task Force on Renewable Energy in 2000 and 2001. He is vice chairman of the UN Global Compact, and chairman of the Global Compact Foundation and the Innovative Vector Control Consortium. He is the author of *Responsible Leadership: Lessons From the Front Line of Sustainability and Ethics* (Greenleaf, 2014)

Tessa Tennant

Tessa Tennant is the founder of Our Voices, which is mobilising faith communities around climate change. She co-founded The Ice Organisation (myice.com); the UK's first equity investment fund for sustainable development in 1988 (now called the Jupiter Ecology Fund); the Carbon Disclosure Project (CDP); the Association for Sustainable & Responsible Investment in Asia (ASRIA); and the UK Social Investment Forum. She also chaired UKSIF and ASRIA and remains a director of the latter. She has received the Sustainability Leadership Award from SAM/SPG of Switzerland, the City of Goteborg International Environmental Leadership Prize, and the Joan Bavaria Award for Building Sustainability into the Capital Markets.

ECCR is a church-based investor coalition, registered charity and membership organisation. ECCR leads and works with others in advocacy, awareness raising and share-holder engagement on issues of business, human rights and environmental stewardship.
